



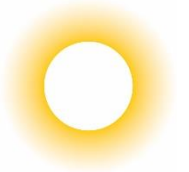

THE AUSTRALIAN ROAD SAFETY AWARDS PRESENTED BY CALTEX

The Australian Road Safety Foundation is a not for profit organisation dedicated to reducing road fatalities and injuries. It achieves these aims through innovative road safety awareness programs, driver education, advocacy and research assistance. Since formation in 2010, The Australian Road Safety Foundation has established a well- known national presence and reputation with strong support from both federal and state governments, the private sector, and the police for its initiatives, programs and events across Australia.

An initiative of the Australian Road Safety Foundation, the Australian Road Safety Awards were established to recognise the outstanding work, achievements and innovation of leading road safety advocates by providing a prestigious platform to formally recognise their contribution and commitment to improving safety outcomes.

The Australian Road Safety Awards program raises awareness regarding road safety generally and promotes strategies that will assist in addressing road safety issues across all sectors. In addition, they provide a vehicle to further promote road safety activities on a national scale and unite these programs under a single banner.



AWARDS CATEGORIES

Community Programs Award presented by CALTEX

Open to all local and community groups, this award recognises original and praiseworthy initiatives, tackling significant local issues in the area of road safety.

School Programs Award presented by SUNCORP

Open to primary and secondary schools, this award is presented to schools that have demonstrated a strong commitment to road safety. It recognizes the work of students and teachers in creating new educational programs that improve young driver behaviour and establish the next generation in road safety awareness and practices.

Local Government Programs Award presented by SAFEROADS

This category acknowledges local initiatives that demonstrate best practice and showcase local government innovation in promoting road safety to their communities.

Corporate Fleet Safety Programs Award presented by HOLDEN

This category recognises larger organisations that have developed a pro-active approach to fleet safety. The winner must demonstrate a holistic safety management approach backed by professional development systems and a strong safety management culture.

Indigenous Programs Award presented by CALTEX

Recognises road injury prevention projects and programs that minimise the impact of road injuries in the Indigenous community. Effective prevention and management programs are essential. These programs need to demonstrate strong leadership and collaboration with the Indigenous community.

State Government Programs Award presented by CALTEX

Open to all State and Territory Governments and their associated agencies. This award will recognise the most effective road safety initiatives and programs undertaken by Governments around the country.

Innovation Programs Award presented by LICENSYS

This open category recognises outstanding innovation in road safety. This could include community, corporate or technology.

Technology Programs Award presented by GPSI

The Technology category recognises platforms/programs designed to improve and / or manage road safety outcomes.



Nominations in each category are evaluated using a number of criteria including:

- Commitment
- Application
- Innovation
- Scope
- Sustainability
- Engagement
- Overall effectiveness

Winners and highly commended recipients will be selected by an independent judging panel.

JUDGING CRITERIA

The Australian Road Safety Awards will be judged according to:

- **The Overall Concept** – How credible is the road safety concept?
- **Impact** – What is the overall impact of the project; this includes both external and internal factors?
- **Adaptability** - To what degree has the project been adapted to its target market?
- **Sustainability and Commitment** - How sustainable is the project/initiative? And if in the initial stages, how committed is the project to making a difference to road safety?
- **Research, Awareness and Reliability** – Has any degree of research been done? How aware is the Australian and/or local community of the project? Is the project reliable and does it work? Please provide any outcome-based statistics and/or evidence.

ELIGIBILITY AND CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

To be eligible to enter the Australian Road Safety Awards, you will be required to meet the following conditions of entry.

- Applicants must agree to their organisation being profiled in the media. The winners may receive publicity through participating media organisations.
- All applicants must have an operating business premise / office or franchise within Australia.
- Entries will only be deemed valid once all details on the submission form are fully completed.
- Agree to supply additional information or verification of information supplied if requested by the judging panel.
- Media sponsors and major supporters are eligible to enter the awards. However, they will not be eligible to enter in a specific category of which they are a sponsor.
- In the event of a dispute, the decision of the judges is final, and no correspondence will be entered into.
- Entries will close at 17:00 (AEST) on 16th January 2020.



IMPORTANT NOTE

Please ensure that your submission is completed on the ARSA Awards Submissions form. Handwritten submissions will not be accepted.

Please be sure to include any additional information which may strengthen your position in the Australian Road Safety Awards. Supporting material should not exceed 20 A4 pages in length. All supporting material must be referenced within your submission form.
