





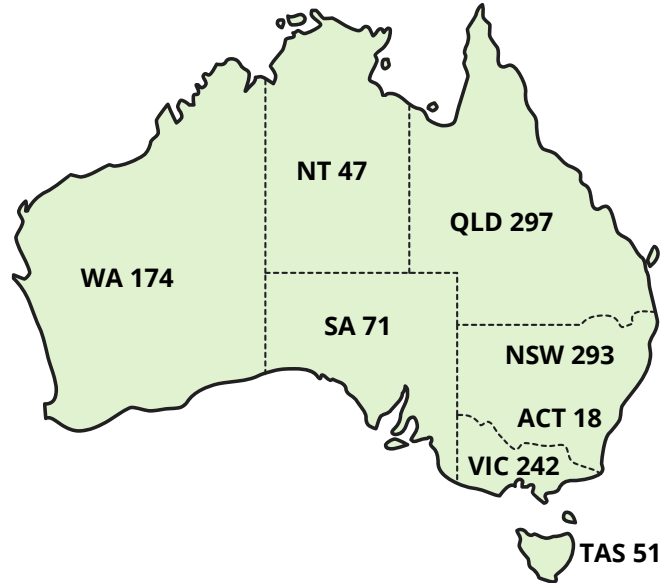

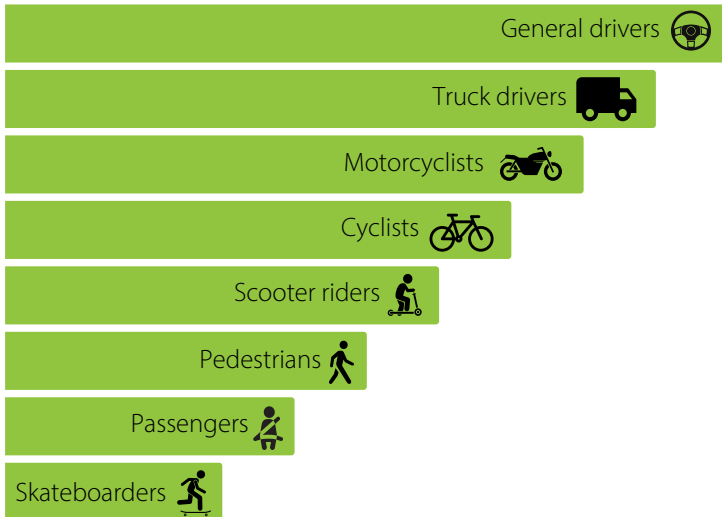

NEW RESEARCH

85% of Australian road users believe individual road users can have the biggest impact on the road toll. From highest to lowest:




3 in 5 Australians admit they take risks on the road

RISKS TAKEN BY DRIVERS

-  **51%** speeding
- 43%** using a mobile phone behind the wheel
- 28%** driving fatigued

RISKS TAKEN BY PEDESTRIANS

-  **28%** listening to headphones
- 28%** texting or using social media on a mobile device
- 18%** blindly following the crowd without looking



95% of Australians believe a 'thank you' wave can help support road safety

4 in 10 use a wave to acknowledge someone else on the road without reason

6 in 10 use a wave to signal that they're happy for another road user to go first
