

Road Toll Update:

312 people have sadly already died on Australian roads this year. This number represents a 4% increase in the number of road fatalities at the same time last year and includes drivers, motorcyclists, passengers, pedestrians and cyclists.[1] In the lead up to Fatality Free Friday in May, we have released **Road Safety Resilience Planning** for all road user groups.

The 17th Fatality Free Friday campaign was launched at Suncorp Stadium, Brisbane on Friday 28th April 2023. This national campaign works by educating road users on the role every individual has in driving down road deaths, serious injury and the ripple effect trauma has across loved ones and our communities.


