Road Toll Update

518 people have sadly already died on Australian roads this year. This number represents a 2.8% increase in the number of road fatalities at the same time last year and includes drivers, motorcyclists, passengers, pedestrians and cyclists.

Heavy Vehicles

During the 12 months to the end of March 2023, 188 people died in crashes involving heavy vehicles. Fatalities on our roads involving heavy vehicles have increased by 6.8% when compared to the corresponding 12-month period one year prior.


